The Process of Assessment and Planning

In an effort to understand the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats (SWOT) facing Timothy Christian School, the Board sought input from parents, students, faculty, staff, and the local community. Information was gathered through an extensive parent/student survey, along with multiple interviews with pastors, legislators, and other ministry leaders.

A compilation of this data was reviewed by staff members who began considering goals that would move Timothy Christian School forward. Goals were grouped into six key areas:

Board and Administration

Academics

Culture and Community

Faculty and Staff

Facilities

Finances

Committees comprised of the Board, administration, faculty, staff and parents were formed in each area to determine the priorities that would become the strategic plan initiatives. They diligently reviewed the information and established initiatives and strategies to accomplish those initiatives. These committees along with the Board and leadership team will continue to provide action steps and input throughout the next four years of the strategic plan to ensure initiatives remain relevant and are being accomplished so that Timothy Christian School can provide an even finer Christ-centered education.



Board and Administration

Initiative 1 - Establish, implement, and maintain excellent board member relationships with constituents and community.

Strategy - Intentionally provide more opportunities to cultivate relationships with stakeholders.

Initiative 2 - Continue to modify and improve governance and administrative roles, and implement a comprehensive plan to establish standard internal controls, procedures and processes.

Strategy - Create and maintain school policy manuals and foundational documents (including a succession plan) and review their effectiveness.

Academics

Initiative 1 - Establish Timothy Christian School as a school of distinction in our academic programs by respected outside agencies.

Strategy - Develop a plan to become a Middle States STEM Program of Distinction school.

Initiative 2 - Update curricular scope and sequence for K4-12 to ensure cohesiveness, relevance and rigor.

Strategy 1 - Benchmark scope and sequence against state and national norms.

Strategy 2 - Expand dual enrollment offerings.

Initiative - Improve constituency involvement, communication, and relations. Promote dynamic spiritual atmosphere within the Timothy Christian School community to encourage stronger biblical knowledge and worldview for students and families.

Strategy 1 - Strengthen alumni relations.

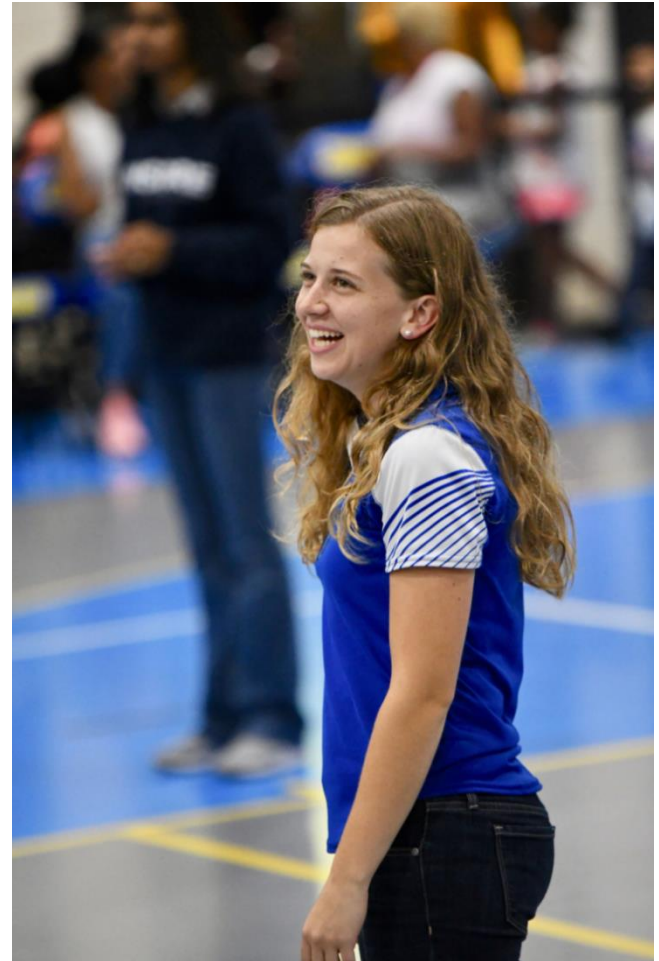
Strategy 2 - Partner with parents by offering biblically-based programs that educate and train our families.
