#### 1. Mapping the travels of Odysseus-Due date: July 28

- Odysseus begins his journey in Troy and ends in Ithacca. However, The Odyssey begins "In Medius Res," or in the middle, and the tale is not told chronologically. Using your text, untangle the tale and create a map depicting the chronological journey Odysseus takes from Troy to Ithacca. While Odysseus's journey is near and around the Mediterranean, most of the locations are mythical. (*Warning all maps available online are purely speculative and are not 'correct', do ensure that you create an original creative document.*)

#### 3. Writing an essay-Due date: First day of school

##### **Prompts**

a. What characteristics did the Greeks value in a leader and how does the author show that Odysseus is a good or bad example of a leader in *The Odyssey*?

b. Some readers argue that Odysseus is not truly heroic because of the assistance he receives from Athena. Agree or disagree with this assertion and defend your answer with evidence from the text.

Write a 5-paragraph essay responding to either prompt **a** or **b**. The essay must consist of an Introduction of 5-6 sentences, three body paragraphs of 5 sentences each and a conclusion, providing closure to your entire argument.

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#### **4.Odyssey of Life writing assignment (Journal entry): First day of school**

After reading Homer's epic poem the Odyssey consider the parallels between the story of Odysseus and your own life. Odysseus undertakes a sometimes exciting, sometimes perilous journey over a long period of time to reach his goal (getting home to Ithaca). Your journal entry must be between 200-250 words.

-In this journal entry, you will think about where you want to be in ten years. What will you accomplish between now and then?

-What "monsters" will challenge you and tempt you, trying to keep you from the goal?

-How is the Odyssey an allegory for your life?
