1. Mapping the travels of Odysseus-Due date July 14th

- Odysseus begins his journey in Troy and ends in Ithaca. However, The Odysseus begins "In Medias Res," or in the middle, and the tale is not told chronologically. Using your text, untangle the tale and create a map depicting the chronological journey Odysseus takes from Troy to Ithaca. While Odysseus's journey is near and around the Mediterranean, most of the locations are mythical. (Warning all maps available online are purely speculative and are not 'correct', do ensure that you create an original creative document.)
